What Is Hypertension?
Hypertension, or high blood pressure, is a common condition. The older you are, the more likely you are to get it. Blood pressure is the force of blood pressing against the walls of your arteries. When it's too high, your heart has to work harder. This can cause serious damage to your arteries. Over time, uncontrolled high blood pressure makes you more likely to get heart disease, stroke, and kidney disease.

SYMPTOMS OF HYPERTENSION

WHAT IS THE NORMAL BLOOD PRESSURE ?
A blood pressure reading is written like this: 120/80. It's read as "120 over 80." The top number is called the systolic, and bottom number is called the diastolic. The ranges are:
Normal: Less than 120 over 80 (120/80)
Elevated: 120-129/less than 80
Stage 1 high blood pressure: 130-139/80-89
Stage 2 high blood pressure: 140 and above/90 and above
Hypertension crisis: higher than 180/higher than 120 – See a doctor right away
If your blood pressure is above the normal range, talk to your doctor about how to lower it.

Hypertension - types
• **Primary (or essential) hypertension**
◦ No identifiable cause - most common form and accounts for 95% of people with hypertension.
• **Secondary hypertension**
◦ Has a known underlying cause (accounts for 5%). Caused by:
◦ Renal disorders (e.g. chronic pyelonephritis, diabetic nephropathy).
◦ Vascular disorders (e.g. coarctation of the aorta).
◦ Endocrine disorders (e.g. primary hyperaldosteronism).
◦ Drugs (e.g. alcohol, cocaine).

Tips to Avoid Hypertension
Hypertension is an insidious high blood pressure in arteries.
• Exercise regularly
• Eat all five food groups and avoid empty-calorie foods
• Avoid being overweight
• Avoid tobacco and the booze
• Drink alcohol in moderation
• Don't smoke
• Don't drink too much caffeine
• Don't drink too much alcohol
• Don't drink too much sugar
• Don't drink too much salt
• Don't drink too much fat
• Don't drink too much cholesterol

HISTORY

The oldest such museum in evidence was Ennigaldi-Nanna's museum dating from c. 530 BC and devoted to Mesopotamian antiquities.

The International Day for Biological Diversity falls within the scope of the UN Post-2015 Development Agenda's Sustainable Development Goals. In this larger initiative of international cooperation, the topic of biodiversity concerns stakeholders in sustainable agriculture; desertification, land degradation and drought; water and sanitation; health and sustainable development; energy; science, technology and innovation, knowledge-sharing and capacity-building; urban resilience and adaptation; sustainable transport; climate change and disaster risk reduction; oceans and seas; forests; vulnerable groups including indigenous peoples; and food security. There is also a Buddhist section where one can find head of a Buddha statue, and Buddha Stupa having remnants of Gautam Buddha, constructed in 3rd century BCE by Sovereign Ashoka.

HISTORY

Early museums began as private collections of wealthy individual, families or institutions of art and rare or curious natural objects and artefacts. These were often displayed in so-called wonder rooms or cabinets of curiosities.

The oldest such museum in evidence was Ennigaldi-Nanna's museum dating from c. 530 BC and devoted to Mesopotamian antiquities.

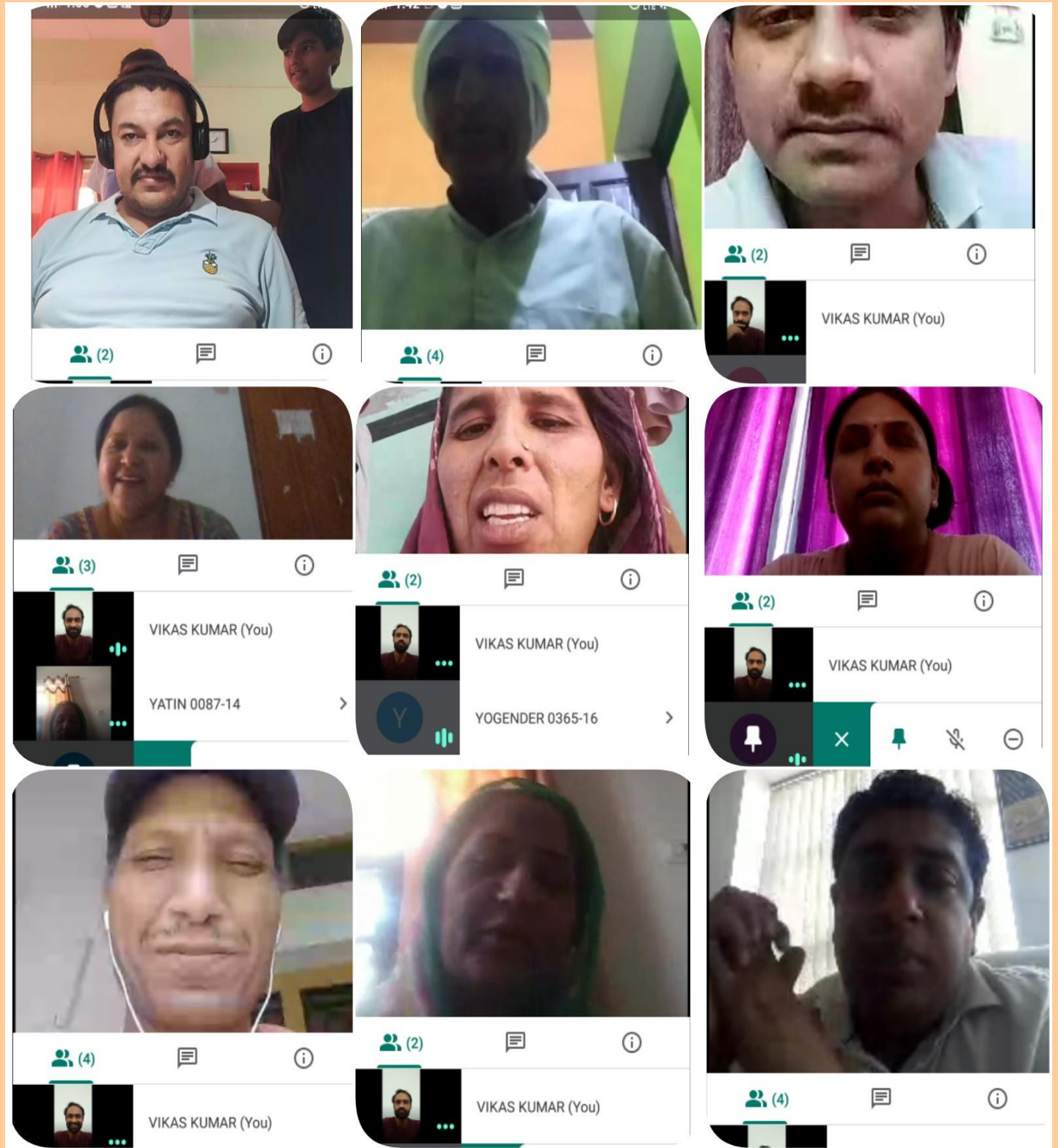
